Friday October 10, 2008—Joel Mabus—7:30pm

Joel Mabus has toured widely and is likely one of the most professional folk musicians flying under the radar of American pop culture. In 2008, he was nominated for the Traditional Music Act of the year at the international Folk Alliance Awards. He has made 19 solo albums in his 30-year recording career. Joel performances provide a unique blend of old-time banjo, blazing acoustic guitar and storytelling that will leave you wanting more.

Saturday, November 29, 2008—Lewis and Burroughs—7:30pm

Eric Lewis and Tommy Burroughs are a dynamic bluegrass duo that played the FAMA stage 2 years ago in a special benefit concert with Fond du Lac's Hillside Ramblers. Hailing from Nashville, Eric and Tommy are frequent performers in Door County. Eric is a great flatpicker and Tommy will be jumping between mandolin, fiddle, and guitar to put on an explosive foot stompin' show.



Saturday, February 7, 2009—David Stoddard—7:30pm

Formerly from Waupun, **David Stoddard** was grand prize winner at the South Florida Folk Festival Singer Songwriter Contest in 2007 and the Kerrville New Folk Award in 2005. If that's not enough, he won the 2004 Minnesota Folk Festival New Folk grand prize. He's recorded 6 records of all-original material and co-written at least 9 full-length large-cast musicals and a few short form musicals. Audiences love his music and he's been accused of being a comedian and he's a pretty good cook.

Friday, March 20, 2009—Stonecross—7:30pm

Stonecross is an exceptional Celtic and World Music duo. Well founded on strong vocals and woven together with a broad mix of instrumentation, they have been bringing their music to fans of traditional and Irish music. Siusan O'Rourke plays guitar and is the lead vocalist. Ziggy Zeitler adds crisp leads on the bouzouki, octave violin, fiddle and an occasional harmonica thrown in for the rebels of the crowd.



Saturday, April 25, 2009—Roller Mills—7:30pm

The Roller Mills String Band is a delightful high energy string band playing old-time and bluegrass traditional fiddle tunes in a style similar to traditional American music of the early and mid 1900's. With a focus on the hammered dulcimer, this group features a complete instrumental ensemble with some of the most powerful pickers from several Bluegrass bands in Southeastern Wisconsin.

Saturday, May 16, 2009—Tracy Grammer—7:30pm

Tracy Grammer returns to the FAMA stage where she had previously preformed with the late Dave Carter. Tracy continues to play Dave's songs as she moves on with her solo career; the CD *Flower of Avalon* was the most-played album on folk radio in 2005. Tracy will provide a great performance playing guitar and violin and enchanting us with her beautiful voice.
